RE: CARES and ARPA Funds

In 2020 Midway City received a total of \$458,048 from the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. The money was spent in the following areas:

It is estimated that the City will receive \$588,909.45 in coronavirus local fiscal recovery funds from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). It received the first tranche of \$312,445.50 in July 2021 and will receive the remainder at least twelve months later. These funds have not yet been spent or committed.

ARPA funds may be used for the following items:

- To respond to the public health emergency or its negative economic impacts, including
 assistance to households, small businesses, and nonprofits, or aid to impacted industries such
 as tourism, travel, and hospitality;
- To respond to workers performing essential work during the COVID-19 public health emergency by providing premium pay to eligible workers;
- For the provision of government services to the extent of the reduction in revenue due to the COVID-19 public health emergency relative to revenues collected in the most recent full fiscal year prior to the emergency; and
- To make necessary investments in water, sewer, or broadband infrastructure.
